Church Charity for 2023/24



The Farming Community Network (FCN) was chosen by the membership as the charity the church will support for the forthcoming year.

FCN has over 400 volunteers based throughout England and Wales, who provide pastoral and practical support to farmers and farming families. FCN has a Christian ministry in farming. Many FCN volunteers are motivated

by faith, showing the love of God to farming people in a very practical way.

Farming Community Network was previously known as the Farming Crisis Network but changed name in 2013 to dispel the myth that they can only offer help at times of crisis and to encourage people to seek help when problems and difficulties first arise, rather than leaving things to reach a real crisis point.

Some stark facts about farmers in the UK -

- 25% of farming families in the UK live below the poverty line.
- Every year, approximately 5,000 farming families across
 England and Wales are affected by bovine TB.
- Approximately 1 farmer a week dies by suicide.

In September 2019, FCN launched a new initiative called FarmWell. FarmWell is a one-stop online resources hub to help farmers and farm businesses stay strong and resilient.



Stoke St Gregory and the surrounding villages have very many links with farming and many in our community are farmers. It will be good to offer our support to the Farming Community Network and hopefully raise awareness and much needed funds over the forthcoming year.
