The Stannard family have kindly shared a wonderfully insightful and interesting article written by their youngest son, Matty, following his surgery for cochlear implants in August last year.

Titled "A New Better Normal" Matty writes about his journey of discovering just how limited his hearing was and the impact of being deaf. He describes his experiences of adjusting to using hearing aids through school, the difficulties he faced with socialising and interacting with friends, and finally the fascinating process of transformation from 'residual hearing + hearing aids' to 'hearing via processors'.

Throughout the article, Matty demonstrates an incredible resilience and an impressive ability to adapt to his hearing disability. He is a black belt in Taekwon-Do, he mountain bikes, he's doing his Silver DofE award and The Ten Tors!! He really is a very special young man!

The Stannards currently have another reason to be proud – Eleanor has recently been offered her first teaching job as an NQT at a school in South Bristol. Many congratulations to Eleanor – she will definitely be a huge asset to the school.
